## 2015 GRENVILLE CLARK AWARD

The Grenville Clark Award is given to a faculty member or administrator whose voluntary activities serve to advance the cause of peace and human rights. Tonight we recognize a legal professional whose volunteerism at the local, state, and national levels is an extension of her work leading the Economic Justice Clinic in the Notre Dame Clinical Law Center. In addition to winning awards from the St. Joseph Valley Project and the St. Joseph County Interfaith Committee for Worker Justice for her service on behalf of social justice issues, she has held leadership roles in a variety of community organizations, including the United Way, the St. Joseph County Bridges Out of Poverty Initiative, the St. Joseph County Literacy Council, and the Indiana Legal Foreclosure Assistance Project. At the request of the chief justice of the Indiana Supreme Court, she also created and implemented a program to train lawyers how to defend foreclosure cases on a pro bono basis. Nationally, she co-chairs the Bellow Scholar committee of the Association of American Law Schools, supporting and guiding empirical scholarship efforts of clinical law professors who are addressing issues of poverty and social justice.
