

2016 GRENVILLE CLARK AWARD

The Grenville Clark Award is given to a faculty member or administrator whose voluntary activities serve to advance the cause of peace and human rights. Specializing in financial management and personal finance, this year's winner has been a respectful yet outspoken critic of excessive fees in the investment industry, challenging its leaders to reduce these charges and redirect a portion of their resources toward humanitarian causes. He has been a faculty fellow of the Center for Social Concerns—where, among other initiatives, he helped facilitate undergraduate participation in micro-lending programs—and he plays an instrumental role in the annual Lenten food drive conducted by the Mendoza College of Business. His service in the community also includes sitting on the investment committee for the Center for Hospice Care and providing free, comprehensive financial planning for employees of local non-profits. A heavily decorated teacher who has been recognized by *Bloomberg Businessweek* as one of 10 favorite undergraduate business professors nationwide, he can regularly be seen throughout the community working to enhance financial literacy as a means for fighting poverty. Those who know him say the only thing bigger than his smile is his heart.
