

2020 GRENVILLE CLARK AWARD

The Grenville Clark Award is given to a faculty member or administrator whose voluntary activities serve to advance the cause of peace and human rights. This year we recognize a scholar, mentor, teacher, and activist who has published internationally respected manuals on restorative justice and consulted for government and nonprofit agencies in the United States and abroad. Through the Center for Social Concerns, she has trained faculty, staff, students, and members of the community in the principles and practice of restorative justice, the impact of her work evident in both local public schools and Notre Dame's own Office of Community Standards. She also brought the national Inside-Out Prison Exchange Program to the University when she co-developed the course "Rethinking Crime and Justice." Believing we are called to cultivate our personal, relational, and institutional capacities for justice, she is a tireless champion for human rights and the "beloved community."
