## **2023 FACULTY AWARD**

The Faculty Award honors a faculty member who, in the opinion of his or her colleagues, has contributed outstanding service to the University, such as through leadership activities, mentoring of peers, or exemplary dedication to students. A member of the Notre Dame faculty since 1996, Paolo Carozza is among the world's most accomplished and influential human rights lawyers. As a scholar, advocate, judge, and academic leader, he has worked to recognize the equal dignity of every person and to promote human flourishing through the rule of law. He is the former president of the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights, served on the State Department's Commission on Unalienable Rights, is a member of the European Commission for Democracy through Law, and was appointed by Pope Francis to the Pontifical Academy of Social Sciences. All of these accomplishments are in addition to his generous leadership on campus, most recently as director of the Kellogg Institute for International Studies, with previous service as associate dean of the Law School and as director of the Center for Civil and Human Rights and the Program on Law and Human Development.
