## 2023 GRENVILLE CLARK AWARD

The Grenville Clark Award is given to a faculty member or administrator whose voluntary activities serve to advance the cause of peace and human rights. Jennifer Huynh is an educator and researcher whose life inside and outside of the classroom work together for the common good.
